Let the sunshine.

Over the last few days we've been enjoying some lovely sunny weather and we hope this continues throughout the summer term. However, it's important that we take extra care to enjoy the sun safely.

We would encourage children to bring a cap or sunhat to wear during breaks, lunchtimes and PE lessons; caps are a good idea. Keeping hydrated is also important, therefore we encourage children to come to school with a water bottle, which can be refilled during the day. Drinks will continue to be available at break times to purchase and on

particularly warm days, water is made available to children throughout lunchtime. It is also useful on hot days to ap-

ply sunscreen before children come to school and many brands available will now last the whole day; which is ideal. However, if your brand does not, children may apply their own sunscreen themselves during lunchtime. We ask that

children please bring this with them and most children should be able to apply this themselves. Any sunscreen children bring in can be kept in their bags, and it is helpful for the container to be labelled with the child's name and class.
