What we did—allocation: £109.850

A proportion of this amount was allocated for extra teaching support throughout the school. This ensured that all children received the support and targeted intervention where needed.

Ensuring that all children are given real life experiences to draw knowledge from is important to us at Rowley Park Academy and is an essential part of the NICER curriculum.

Year 5 and year 6 pupils are now allocated a digital device to enhance and support their learning.

What is Pupil Premium money for?

The Government identified money for those children receiving a free school meal, or those who are looked after by the Local Authority to help to close the gap in attainment between those in receipt of Pupil Premium and those without. Schools are required to evidence the impact of this spending and report to Parents and Governors.

What was the impact in 2014-15?

In 2014, the average attainment gap for disadvantaged pupils was -15 points (-6% Reading, -35% writing, -4% maths). In 2015 the gap closed rapidly and disadvantaged pupils are now only 2.7 points below all pupils nationally (+11% reading, -14% writing, -5% maths).

Although there is a gap of 14 points in writing which is above the national gap, this has reduced significantly from 2014 where the gap was 35%.
