## Teacher's Message

### **NICER**

This term, the childrens' challenge pack is "Lest we forget". The challenge outcome is "Can we transform an area of our community through 3D art so that we can remember fallen heroes?

We will kickstart the term with a History focus investigating primary and secondary sources – comparing and evaluating how useful they are to find out about life during WW2. We will explore sculpture in art as we decide how to remember those that fought at this time.

## English

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In English, children will be learning how to write their own speeches for team captains, writing a balanced report linked to our challenge pack and a narrative inspired by the short film 'The Piano'. They will also be exploring our class text 'Friend or Foe' and understand a variety of different texts in our VIPER reading lessons.

## Maths

In mathematics, we will be focusing on place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We will also begin to simplify fractions and solve real life problems involving fractions.

In arithmetic we will be working with bigger numbers up to 7 digits. We will use a variety of resources and methods to solve more complex reasoning and word problems.

## P.E

Our PE days this term are Mondays.

Please ensure PE kit is in school every day and that it is clearly labelled.

Earrings need to be taken out before school or covered up. Hair is to be tied up or a hair tie needs to be brought in. Children will also have Forest School on Wednesdays.

## R.E
